As always, it was an energetic meeting teeming with ideas and a desire to see Illinois community colleges grow in delivery and quality of online learning. Notable developments from the retreat are below.

An Innovations committee was developed to bring emerging technologies and strategies to ILCCO members on a quarterly basis. Exploring the "new" as well as the "fun" with distance learning and education technologies will keep our colleges at the forefront of best practices.

Professional development continues to be an important area for ILCCO. An instructional technology conference was started to provide cutting edge training for staffing in instructional technology, faculty development and distance learning. The conference will be held in the summer of 2009. A slate of professional development events is being also planned to provide training, demonstrations on vendor products, and information about best practices at colleges.

Collaboration remains a continuing theme for ILCCO. Embedded throughout the retreat's discussions was the need and desire to collaborate with other colleges. Throughout our work this year we will continue to see collaboration play out through the sharing of information, resources, and courses.

Five years have passed since ILCCO completed a strategic planning process. The committee agreed that it was time to create a new strategic plan. Over the course of this year, ILCCO's Governance and Finance Committee will lead the development of a new strategic plan.

The redevelopment of ICE will be completed and implemented for use in the spring 2009 semester, providing us a much needed update in the software plus additional flexibility to accommodate course sharing in flex start courses.

ILCCO is off to a great start and we look forward to a great year.

Black Hawk College's Online Initiatives

For many years, Black Hawk College has been growing its collection of online courses according to student demand, viewing the 80+ online courses as a learning option for our students. As interest in online courses grew and overshadowed some of our other delivery options, students started asking about doing their entire program online, so the College began intentionally developing specific courses that would allow a student to complete their degree objective entirely online. In 2007, Black Hawk College applied for and received accreditation through the Higher Learning Commission to make its AA and AS degrees available entirely online. As the College worked toward meeting HLC expectations and launching/marketing the degrees, we formed what is affectionately called our "Ducks-in-a-Row Committee." This group is comprised of key people who support online faculty and students in a variety of ways: advising, tutoring, counseling, Compass testing, registration, marketing, academic planning (deans), library reference support, faculty training and support (TLC), IT/Help Desk, bookstore, financial aid, student activities/engagement (dean), etc. This committee represents our distributed distance learning support system, collaboratively focused on refining our support systems, expanding some of them to be more responsive to the needs of entirely online students, and creating a one-stop-shop Web page with all information pertinent to online learning at BHC, whether or not

students are pursuing their degree entirely online or in a more blended format: http://www.bhc.edu/OnlineLearningCenter A few of these initiatives are still in development or awaiting final budgetary approval this summer, as we prepare for the official launch of our online degrees this fall.

The faculty have also been working to address issues related to teaching online. For example, the Alternative Delivery Committee of the Faculty Senate has developed a *Best Practices in Exemplary Online Instruction* guide: http://facweb.bhc.edu/tlc/learn/onlinelearning/exemplary.html and a database of online course evaluation items that online faculty can use to create customized evaluation instruments for their classes: http://facweb.bhc.edu/tlc/events/ondemand/classroomassessment.html. This committee is also examining the key variables that the literature says affect online retention, comparing them to how BHC is doing in each area, and making recommendations to the Senate and the Ducks committee for services and activities that they believe can strengthen the retention of our online students. We are also participating in the ILCCO Online Retention special interest group. Meanwhile, the Teaching/Learning Center (1) provides faculty assistance for developing high-quality online courses; (2) offers face-to-face and online training options on a variety of topics pertinent to teaching online (http://facweb.bhc.edu/tlc/events/qccalendar.html); (3) coordinates a learning community for online instructors; (4) works with individual faculty on skill development or other support for utilizing WebCT and other technology tools that can enrich their online classes; and (5) serves as a resource to the academic and technical community.

Finally, Black Hawk is actively participating in course sharing through ILCCO/ICE. Not only has this effort provided some of our students with access to additional online classes that we do not offer, but it has also provided additional enrollment in some of our sections.
