ILCCO and UIS Awarded Peer Mentoring HECA Grant

Illinois Community Colleges Online (ILCCO) and the University of Illinois at Springfield (UIS) were awarded a HECA grant at the October 2nd Illinois Board of Higher Education Board Meeting to pilot peer mentoring in online courses.

The "Increasing Retention in Online Courses through Peer Mentoring" project is designed to improve student retention rates in online courses through an online peer mentoring program. Trained peer mentors will serve as a support system in online courses modeling effective behavior to students and assisting faculty in providing effective communication and support for students to foster a successful online learning experience. Implementation of the peer mentoring program is intended to reduce course-level barriers to persistence towards degree.

ILCCO and UIS will focus on preparation and project development over the current fall semester, training faculty and peer mentors, and creating a communication and web resources portal. In the spring 2008 semester, seven ILCCO colleges will implement peer mentoring in online courses with lower than average retention rates. Based on the UIS experience, it is expected that peer mentoring will increase retention and student success in online courses involved with the grant. ILCCO hopes to build on the experience through the peer mentoring project and offer further opportunities upon completion of the HECA grant.

The peer mentoring project partners seven ILCCO community colleges with UIS: Black Hawk College, Elgin Community College, Harper College, Lake Land College, Moraine Valley Community College, Triton College, and Waubensee Community College.

Lake Land College Uses Camtasia Studio as a Time Saving Technology

Have you ever found yourself repeating the same concepts over and over to students during office hours? Do you teach how to use software packages and find yourself repeating the same steps over and over? If this is the case, then Camtasia Studio can be a time saver for you and help you reach your audio/visual learners more effectively.

What is Camtasia Studio you may be asking? Camtasia Studio is a product of the software company TechSmith (www.techsmith.com) and can be likened to a Swiss army knife. Camtasia is a full featured program used to create screenrecordings. A screenrecording is basically a video screen capture of your computer's desktop. The recorder software bundled with Camtasia Studio records all of the mouse movements. As you move the mouse pointer around on screen and perform tasks such as opening software windows and typing a document, the recorder tracks the movement. Camtasia can also record web cam video while recording the desktop screen. This can make your screenrecordings seem more personable to your students. On computers with the Microsoft Office loaded, it also loads a PowerPoint plugin that allows you to record directly in PowerPoint in Slide show view.

Editing is a breeze. No programming skills are required. The final production can be created by importing all the clips and assembling the clips on a timeline. The edited video can be for production output. Additional enhancements can also be added to the timeline such as transitions, callouts and zooms and pans. Callouts and zoom and pans can help keep your audience focused on the important points of your video.

Additionally you can add quizzes and surveys to your production to help students recall the information. Camtasia is a SCORM-compliant application, which allows you to use the quizzing feature and record the grade within a learning management system such as Blackboard. Another useful feature of Camtasia is the ability to add 508-compliant captions to your videos. This will make your videos more memorable and accessible to all your students.

Production is also a breeze and Camtasia gives you several different output formats to choose from such as Flash, QuickTime, Windows Media, and even iPod video. It is quick and easy to produce and share the video with your students. TechSmith also has a video service called screencast.com. Once you have signed up for the service you can upload a newly produced video to the service to share instantly. While not exactly "research" in its purest form, visiting the Educause Learning Initiative's Web site can help you to be informed almost at a glance. You can then use this information to consider emerging technologies as you plan for your own institution's teaching and learning needs.

Each month, an emerging technology is featured. By viewing a brief, you can learn:

- what it is
- how it works
- where it is going
- why it matters to teaching and learning
